PRO-ACTIVE PARENTING

Parents and carers have a difficult and important job and CCSP have always been able to help and support our families within the Diocese. We have been listening to the needs of the families and schools we have been supporting as well as attending the national CAMHS mental health training day, which discussed preventative measures to help with the mental health crisis the country is facing and have rebranded our Patchwork Parenting courses.

Pro-active Parenting launched on Wednesday, 2 November 2022 at St John the Baptist R C Primary School in Dartmouth. The new course now runs over two sessions each 3.5 hours long where we explore themes and strategies within the home to support everyday family life. These themes will be adapted to the setting to incorporate the Primary Years and then will be further adapted for the Teenage Years when we visit a secondary settina.

- 2. Needs vs Wants
- 3. Effective Praise and Communication
- 4. Boundary Setting and Responsibilities
- 5. Behaviour we don't like and the Consequences

Session 2:

- 6. Anxiety and Attachment

- 8. Technology and the Family

New service to be provided by CCSP

CCSP now provide a Rainbows service for CAST schools. We now offer Continuing Professional Development (CPD) for delivering Bereavement and Loss programmes within schools using Rainbows age related peer support programmes, which help foster emotional healing among children, young people and adults.

Our Parent Facilitator Sarah Watts is now a Rainbows Director and can offer high quality training in bereavement and loss by supporting communities in reviewing or developing their own bereavement policy and procedures.

This service is open to all CAST schools to become a Rainbows site and we will provide training for all members of staff and further training for facilitators and co-ordinators to suit the specific needs of your school. For those schools that are already Rainbows sites, ongoing support is provided to affirm and advise the trained facilitators and co-ordinators that run the programmes. 


