On behalf of all the staff of St Nicholas, I would like to say a huge well done to our year 6 and year 2 children. Year 6 children took their SATs tests last week. Leading up to the tests, the children worked hard to prepare and we were incredibly proud of how they handled all tests with such maturity- they were all so keen to do their best. They were super role models for our year 2 children who have taken their SATs tests this week. Again we are so pleased with how well the children have managed these. The year 6 SATs test papers have been sent off for marking and the results will be published in July.

OPAL(outdoor play and learning) Project

Before COVID, the school invested in OPAL- a project to develop our playtime provision to provide for the 16 different types of play needs. COVID stalled the progress of the project- however, we are now in a position to get things moving again! We are very pleased to announce that we have appointed Rachel Fox as our OPAL playleader. Rachel will work closely with the OPAL coordinator, Mrs E Martin, to bring fantastic play opportunities to the children at St Nicholas. 
Milk Bottle Tops

Book for Bishop Mark






Plymouth Cast Schools were invited to contribute to a book for Bishop Mark in anticipation of his departure from the Diocese of Plymouth.

The children loved the chance to see these animals close up and ask Martin questions such as how fast does a peregrine falcon go? How much does a Harris Hawk eat a week? How do birds like Boris the Little Owl clean his beak? Where do Eagle Owls live?

They set a fantastic example to the rest of the school, being ready, respectful and safe for our guests both Martin and the feathered kind. We look forward to showing you our final art projects soon!

This week all of the children in KS2 took part in a 'Reading Roundabout' led by Jade and Ali from the Devon School Library Service. Jade and Ali brought hundreds of books into school and each KS2 child was able to pick out three books that they would like to go into the library so that they can borrow them to read.

To encourage the children to read the three books they chose and to broaden the variety of authors and genres that they enjoy reading, we are running a 'Reading Roundabout' challenge.

- Children who read five books written by different authors will also be awarded with a Star Reader sticker from our school librarians.
- Children who read seven books written by different authors will also receive a certificate.
