### **First Holy Communion 2017**

We look forward to welcoming those children who would like to receive Holy Communion for the first time in 2017. If your child is in school year 3 and you would like them to prepare, you must attend a Registration meeting on **Thursday 17 November at 7.00pm** at St Nicholas School EX1 3EG. There is no need for the children to attend this meeting. The preparation will begin in January with one monthly meeting on a Saturday morning at St Nicholas School for all parents and children and a further session, just for the children, once a month on a weekday evening at 6.00pm. We will give you a note of all the dates at the registration meeting. As well as being committed to these meetings we ask you to make a commitment (which is the obligation of all Catholics) to attend Mass each Sunday in the parish where you live.
