Uniform Consultation

We had a fantastic response (224) to the consultation about changing the white polo tops in the summer term to bottle green. 91.5% agreed to this change which should help the uniforms look less grubby after outside play. Comments included: *"brilliant idea", "yes, yes, yes, I can put the vanish and scrubbing brush away through the summer months", "fantastic".* We did have other comments and suggestions which will all be considered. This year will be a transitional year so if you already have white polo tops they may also be worn this summer. From Easter 2021 Governors have decided that all children should be wearing the green polo tops. We have advised both our uniform suppliers and they are now offering the green polos (at the same price).
