We are trialling a new strategy to give children feedback and help children to make stronger progress in Maths and Literacy.

The verbal feedback pilot, set up in September, means that teachers are not writing comments in children's books. When you look through your child's books on Parent's

Evening you will find less 'traditional' commenting. The teachers are using their time by talking to the children during the lesson about successes and next steps. Mrs Walmsley, Miss Reynolds and myself have been looking at children's maths and literacy books and are really pleased to see children making stronger progress as a result of more immediate feedback.

Doctors in Devon are reminding parents to download and consult the **HANDi** paediatric app. The free app is loaded with expert advice, support and guidance for common childhood illnesses. It covers a range of common conditions such as high temperatures, abdominal pain, headaches and rashes. The app asks a series of questions about the symptoms the child has and then advises the best course of action to take, whether to treat the condition at home, consult a pharmacist or GP and if it is serious, to head to A&E
