Headteacher's News

Our teachers were delighted to join 8 other Exeter schools last week to share good practice in the teaching of reading. With the new curriculum expectations for all year groups this gave staff a fantastic opportunity to hear about different ways that schools are approaching the development of secure reading skills.

Last Friday, on the Non Pupil Day teachers from the 12 CAST Central schools worked on teaching Non Fiction. We have seen standards in writing rise considerably across the school since joining the 2 year project in September. Look out in your children's books for some fantastic sentence structure and exciting vocabulary!

Fire Procedures & Lock Down Policy

We recently had a fire alarm sound after 3.15pm which resulted in some confusion in the clubs and activities taking place after school, especially as parents were waiting to pick up their children. We therefore need to remind all parents what our school fire policy is at <u>all times of day</u> when the alarm is sounded or a fire discovered.

ON HEARING THE FIRE ALARM

- The fire brigade will be called
- All teachers including music teachers or those leading an after school club will leave the building with the class, group or individual child they are with in a silent and orderly manner.
- They will proceed at walking pace to the assembly point which is at the back of the large playground behind the school.
- The class teacher or responsible person will take a register.
- All persons must be confirmed to be present.
- All must remain until dismissed by the Headteacher or responsible person

Our policy is that **all** children must be accounted for. We ask that parents who may be waiting to pick up after a club **do not** take their children and leave the site but also evacuate to the back of the school if they are in the building or remain on Ringswell Avenue. Once registers have been taken and we are satisfied that all are safe, we will then allow you to leave the site with your child/ren.

The School also has a new lock down policy which will soon be shared on the website. We intend to have a practice with all children later this term to ensure they understand the procedures.

Late pick up of Children

We are becoming increasingly concerned about the number of children who are not collected at 3.15pm and instead are left waiting in Reception for parents to collect them at a later time. We of course understand that sometimes you have to deal with unforeseen circumstances and appreciate a call to let us know you will be late. However, we are unable to allow children to continually be collected late. Please ensure you make the appropriate arrangements to get here on time for 3.15pm. Children who are left waiting may be taken to After School Club and you will be charged £8 for your child's supervision.
