Resources

We're pleased to have once again signed off a balanced budget for the next financial year. The resources committee, Headteacher and School Business Manager have worked hard to put together a budget which provides the best possible outcomes for children, within increasingly tight levels of funding and rising costs.

Throughout the next academic year we will continue to ensure that the resources available to the school are put to the best possible use, to benefit the children in our school and the quality of their education.

Teaching and Learning

As a Teaching and Learning committee, this year we have focused on scrutinising and understanding school data to ensure the best outcomes for pupils. We are very pleased with results from EYFS, and also delighted that 94% of pupils are going into KS2 having passed their phonics tests. The SATS results for Year 2 were excellent with a much increased percentage of children achieving greater depth. At Year 6 we saw a strong improvement in writing from 2016 which demonstrates the impact of actions taken this year.

As a committee we have also undertaken several visits to the school and have been impressed to see how the Assessment for Learning programme is improving teaching across the school. We have seen how the Accelerated Reader programme and the Pastoral Support Worker are having a positive impact on all pupils in the school particularly for our pupil premium children.

The Summer is often a period of transition for many people, and you will already be aware that we have sadly been saying goodbye to a number of members of staff recently, including Mr Hadden, Mr Tebbutt and Elicia Down.
