Corona Virus (Covid-19)

Phones:

It is not necessary for children to have a mobile phone in school. However, we appreciate that there may be rare occasions where it is necessary for a child to bring their phone into school. If your child needs to bring their mobile phone into school for any reason, the phone MUST be handed into the office where it will be kept in the school safe for the duration of the school day. This is to ensure that all children are effectively safeguarded. Your child will be able to collect their phone from the office at the end of the school day. Any phones not handed into the office will be confiscated by school staff and will need to be collected from the office by parents.

Reports

In September, Plymouth CAST changed the assessment system that all of its schools use to track progress and attainment. Unfortunately, the old system was used by St Nicholas teachers to draft school reports which would usually be published and shared with you in March. We are now looking at a new format for the school report to ensure that we can effectively share information about your child's learning and progress. However, this means that reports will not be shared with you until June. You will have an opportunity to discuss your child's progress with his/her teacher at the parents' evenings due to take place on the 18th and 24th March. Once you have received your child's school report in June, the school will hold an open classroom event so that you can drop in to discuss the report should you wish. The date for this will be shared with you next term.
