Headteacher's News

All teachers from Year 1 to 6 are involved in a piece of research around outcomes in maths at the moment. Regular looks at children's books and teacher's planning show us that children are making good progress within their maths units. However, when they take a test their performance drops.

Teacher's are using some of their maths lessons now to model how

to approach shorts tests and talking through their thoughts as they go.

The children are then having short, weekly experiences of timed test questions to see if this improves their results on the longer, half termly assessments. A bit like taking a driving test – you wouldn't be fully prepared if you hadn't practiced the test routes and skills before you take it!

We will be sharing the assessments with you at the end of the year.

Information

GDPR

You may be aware that from May, the rules around data protection are changing. The 'General Data Protection Regulation' (GDPR) will change how we can use your personal data and keep it safe, and will also strengthen your rights over your own data.

The point of this is to make sure sensitive or private information about yourselves and your children stays safe. Whilst it is similar to the current Data Protection Act in many ways, there are a few differences, so we need to make a few changes at the school in order to ensure we remain compliant.

One of these changes is that CAST will update our privacy notice. This will be issued to you in due course and will be available on our school website.

As part of our work to comply with the GDPR, we will also re-seek consent for using photographs or videos of your child on our website and Facebook, internal displays or other school materials. A Permissions form will soon be distributed to you per child. It will last until your child leaves the school but it is important to note that you may withdraw consent for any item at any time.

Bus Service to and from St Peters

We surveyed parents last term who use the free, supervised bus service to and from St Peters School as we are no longer able to offer this service free of charge.

Parents overwhelmingly wanted the service to continue with a charge of 50p per trip.

This will start on 1st May. We will be selling a 10 Travelcard for £5 which you can purchase from the Office or (preferably) via Parentpay. Each time your child/ren travel a square will be marked as used for each child. The terms and conditions are as follows:

- We reserve the right to refuse travel without a valid Travelcard and you will be contacted to collect your child from school. It is *your responsibility* to ensure your child has a valid Travelcard if you wish them to use the service.
- We will not accept responsibility for lost or damaged tickets. You will need to purchase a new card to access the service.
- You can purchase up to 4 Travelcards per transaction and use them for your whole family.
