Headteacher's News

Information

School Uniform - footwear

Please note that boots and trainers are not part of school uniform. Your child may wear boots or trainers to walk to and from school but please ensure that they have black shoes to change into once they are in school.

Early Drop Off

Children may not be dropped off and left at school before 8.30am unless they are in Breakfast Club. Before this time they <u>must</u> be supervised by an adult. At 8.30am there is a member of staff on the playground and they can then be left as there is supervision. Any children dropped off early may be taken to Breakfast Club and you may incur a charge of £3 per child.

Provision of Paracetomol

Please note that if your child needs paracetomol (Calpol) in school this needs to be provided by you as we do not keep a supply in school. Please also note that we are unable to administer ibuprofen to children without a prescription.

School Milk

School milk is available for ALL children! If your child is currently under 5 they receive free milk at school, funded by the UK Government's Nursery Milk Scheme. When your child turns 5 or if they are already over 5, you have the option to pay for their milk. We have made arrangements with the UK's leading school milk supplier, Cool Milk, to supply milk at a small subsidised daily cost. What you need to do is visit http://www.coolmilk.com as soon as possible and select "Register your child for milk", then follow the on-screen instructions to register and pay. A portion of fresh, chilled milk at mid-morning break provides protein, calcium and other vital nutrients, important for your child's growth and development. It's also a great way to bridge the gap between breakfast and lunch, re-hydrating your child and helping them to concentrate in class.
