

Our courses give parents a chance to learn strategies and techniques that have been used in professional practice with success. As well as group activities allowing you to meet others going through similar experiences and share ideas and support. The training will take place at Devon Disability Collective, 22 Marsh Green Road. Marsh Barton. Exeter. EX2 8PQ. On site parking is free. The ticket price includes both days training, teas & coffees, soft drinks and a selection of fruit and biscuits. Lunch is not included. All courses will run from 9:30am until 2:30pm to allow for school drop offs and collections. This year's courses include:
