# Headteacher's News

The Government has made significant changes to assessment nationally, and consequently our school assessment systems look very different this year. When you come to parents evening in two weeks' time you will be given an indication for the end of year prediction for your child's achievement and the next steps your child needs to make to achieve this. Further information will be displayed on the large screen in the hall during Parent's evening to help you to make sense of some of the changes in expectation and language.

If your child is in Year 2 or Year 6 it is important that you try to come to next week's information sessions run by the teachers so that you are fully aware of the changes to the SATs process and expectations for 2016.

## Safeguarding: Dismissing Year 3 and 4 children

As always, we are constantly reviewing procedures to enhance the safety of the children. From Monday 7th March children in Totnes, Kingswear and Rougemont Classes will be dismissed at the end of the day in the same way as Year 1 and 2 children. The children will be held in their classrooms until they are individually released to their parent, agreed adult or older sibling collecting them. As per NSPCC advice (<a href="https://www.nspcc.org">www.nspcc.org</a>) we do not permit children under the age of 12 to collect younger siblings. Parents of children in Totnes, Kingswear and Rougemont are invited to wait directly outside their children's classroom after 3.10pm until the class are dismissed. Please note that children will not be released unless an adult comes to collect them. If it is another adult collecting please either let the teacher know on the playground in the morning, send in a note or phone the office. For those parents with children in younger classes, don't worry – we will hold onto the Year 3 and 4 children until you have collected your younger ones.

#### **Scarlet Fever**

You may have heard in the press that the numbers of children contracting Scarlet Fever nationally has increased considerably. At St Nicholas we have had a number of recent cases. We have sought additional advice from the Public Health Team as to how we can minimise the chances of children catching this airborne infection. If your child is diagnosed with Scarlet Fever please ensure that they stay off school for at least 24 hours after starting a course of antibiotics. If they have not been prescribed antibiotics, they should not return to school until they have fully recovered. At school we will continue to ensure that the children wash their hands properly after going to the toilet and before eating as this is the most effective way of avoiding infection. We also wish to reassure you that all school fittings, furnishings and equipment are regularly cleaned as part of an ongoing cleaning cycle. Additional deep cleaning will also take place during the Easter holiday period.

#### Headlice

We have a number of cases of headlice in the school. Please check your child/ren's hair and see Parentmail for more information.
