Headteacher's News

I usually use this section of the newsletter to let you know about activities and progress with school improvement. It is therefore disappointing to have to let you know that much of my time over the last two weeks has been spent discussing and meeting with angry residents, Highways and the Police about the appalling parking and behaviour of some parents when picking up and dropping off their children. I am well aware that this is a minority of parents, but the number is increasing.

Due to the high number of parents who believe they have a right to park in the school carpark we are once again forced to use the school budget to man the gates. Whilst the carpark looks large, there are often only just enough spaces for all our staff and on many occasions staff are blocked from leaving. The Stagecoach bus service, used by approximately 60 children a day, is dependent on leaving on time to get to its connection at St Peters. Once again, parents parking in the carpark are jeopardizing this service by blocking the bus in.

I have reported the chaos to Highways and the Police and am expecting them to visit shortly to see the problem for themselves.

I cannot think of a parent who would not want the school to deal effectively with children who are not following the rules; unfortunately the parents parking on double yellow lines, across driveways and in the carpark without permission are doing just that.

Please remember:

- It is illegal to park on double yellow lines they are there to help the flow of traffic <u>out</u> of Ringswell Avenue.
- You are trespassing if you park in the carpark without permission or a permit.
- Please show some courtesy to our neighbours around the school by not parking across their driveways.

I look forward to being able to get on with my core job of improving the outcomes of your children by being able to focus on teaching and learning.
