Increase in Prices - Nursery Hours and School Meals

Please note that from 1st January 2020 the price for a school meal will go up to £2.30. The minimum payment on Parentpay (5 meals) will therefore be £11.50. Additional Nursery hours will increase to £4.20 per hour.

Parentpay

Parentpay are pleased to be able to offer the facility to be able to pay for items via bank transfer. Once your bank details have been entered this forms a very quick and easy method of payment without the need to enter credit or debit card details. Should you wish to, it also allows you to set up the "Auto Top-Up" facility to make regular meal payments, as your balance drops below a certain threshold, set by you.
