Contact Tracing over Easter

To support the NHS Test and Trace process, staff will be available for the first few days of the Easter holiday to fulfil necessary contact tracing responsibilities.Parents and carers **must** inform us by emailing <u>head@stncs.uk</u> of a positive case if either symptoms or a positive home LFD test occurred <u>within 2 days</u> of your child/ren being in school. Where this is the case, we will assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as your child/ren may have been infectious whilst at school. Positive tests after 2 days <u>do not</u> need to be reported to the school but you should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Leaving the Site

We are still under COVID restrictions and using the one way system. Please would parents leave the site speedily after pick up in the afternoon and not congregate near the school gates which blocks the exit for other parents.
