# **Head of School's News**

The second half of the summer term always brings lots of sunshine and this half term is no different! It has been lovely to see the children outside enjoying their learning and play in the sun. The new play equipment that Miss Frost has introduced weekly in our celebration assemblies, is being treated respectfully by the children and really enhancing their playtimes.

As well as this, Mrs Martin, Miss Rachel and the MTA team have been working hard to reintroduce The Outdoor Play and learning Project (OPAL) to our school. The OPAL project has enabled us to consider how we provide for the 16 different types of play needs during break times. The children have enjoyed being creative in their play, using crates, tarpaulin and other resources for den building. The playground is full of lovely chalk pictures created by the children and some children are really enjoying the opportunity to engage in small world play. #### Drop off

Whilst the gates are open at school from 8:30am the whistle is not blown until 8:40am. There will always be one staff member on duty, but because of the open grounds, we request that parents stay to supervise their children until the whistle is blown. This will ensure that all children are safe and do not wander back out of the school grounds when parents have left. This of course does not include children in year 6 where parents have considered them old enough to walk into school on their own.

#### Lateness

We are noticing an increasing number of children arriving to school late. Registration is at 8:45am- 8:55am. If your child arrives at school after 8:45am, they will receive a late mark on the register. If your child arrives after 8:55am, the register will be marked as an unauthorised absence. A number of late marks or unauthorised absences will be picked up and discussed in attendance meetings held with the senior leadership team and the educational welfare officer. Persistent lateness will result in you receiving a letter from the school or even the Educational Welfare Officer.

As mentioned above, the sun is out! Please ensure that your child comes to school with a bottle of suncream with their name on, a sun hat and a bottle of water. Thank you.
